The Big Picture

Prins Henrik School is an international school with more than 800 students and 46 nationalities, ranging from pre-school to 3.g (final year of school). The school is a member of the AEFE network, which means it is approved by the French Ministry of Education and offers the standard French exams (Brevet og Baccalauréat), along with the national Danish “folkeskole” exam at the end of 9th grade and the DFB (a combined French and Danish graduation exam). Our main focus is academic excellence, multilingualism, and an openness to different cultures.

- Promote cultural awareness and strong linguistic skills
- The individual child's development within a close-knit and secure community
- Develop and renew teaching and learning methods

Parents act as stakeholders and are a vital part of upholding the school democratic operations.



Our Organisation

Prins Henrik School is approved by the AEFE-network and governed by the school board. The school operates with a three-part collaboration between the AEFE, the school board and the administration. Here is a diagram of our organisation:



What languages are taught?

French, Danish, English, German, Spanish...

Language learning is a central part of our curriculum at all levels. French is the main language of instruction. Danish is taught as either a second language or for native speakers. English is taught from the maternelle level and students choose between German and Spanish in 7th grade. Some students study several languages via CNED.

For non-French speaking students

Springboard to French: non-French speaking students can enroll at the school until 7th grade. Chloé Larrose teaches French as a second language and offers additional assistance for students to enable them to quickly follow the French curriculum.

FLE classes / FLSco (French as a second language) from 6th / 7th grade.

DFB is a two-part leaving examination which includes both the French baccalauréat and two subjects from the Danish final examination: Danish and history. DFB enables students to apply for higher education in both Denmark and elsewhere.



What if my child needs special assistance?

As an international school, Prins Henrik School wants to ensure that all their students succeed and feel welcome at school. We offer support schemes and teaching assistance to students with special needs. Students receive a helping hand and support suited to their specific needs, in order to provide the framework for them to develop and benefit from their lessons.


If the child has specific needs, either related to health or learning issues, you are welcome to contact your child's teacher in primaire or Vie Scolaire (school counselors) at the collège or gymnasium level.



How do we help our students feel welcome?

At Prins Henrik School we are wholly dedicated to ensuring the well-being of our students and it is a central part of our school development project. The Well-Being Group, founded in 2011, is based on Scandinavian values. The aim is for all students to feel heard and supported, to ensure their well-being. The Well-Being group helps students who have been bullied or experienced inappropriate behavior, and are prepared to intervene in any situation on a professional level.

Every year the school has a well-being presentation for the students with different activities.



Field trips, explorations, travels

Throughout their education, students participate in school trips, where they develop their sense of independence, their linguistic skills, and their openness to the world. Their shared experiences in different settings and contexts help teach them to be “citizens of the world.”

In maternelle/preschool: little field trips where the children get to explore their city and surrounding nature.

From 1st grade: overnight trips or camps in Denmark or Scandinavia.

In collège and gymnasium: research trips, language trips and/or journeys in connection with an elective.



La Vie Scolaire

for collège and gymnasium level students

Students in 6th grade to 3.g (final year) can get assistance at the Vie Scolaire office every day of the week. La Vie Scolaire team, directed by the school counselor (CPE), ensure the safety of the students, register absences and tardies, and are available to help students with any questions or problems outside of class hours. The school counselor works closely with the teachers and parents to ensure a smooth school year for everyone, and that everything is in accordance with the school guidelines. The school counselor also acts as a guide for the student representatives in the student council for Collège og Gymnasium (CVLC).

Before/After School Programs

Students in Primaire: Where do I go after school? To SFO!

7:20 to 5pm

The SFO (after school program) is open for students outside of regular school hours, before school in the morning, when school ends, and during school holidays.

SFO maternelle is for children in maternelle. SFO offers activities outside of regular school hours within the maternelle designated areas of the school.

SFO/KLUB is for students from 1st to 5th grade outside of regular school hours located in the SFO designated rooms on the ground floor, within the primaire building.

SFO/KLUB offers many different activities: music, sensory activities, play, sports, cooking, and crafts.

Before/After School Programs

Students from 6th to 9th grade:

Where do I go after school? Junior club – Kompas!

Open from 2pm to 6:30pm from Monday to Friday and some school holidays.

During the school year Junior club Kompas is available to all 6th, 7th, 8th, and 9th graders, if registered. There are creative, social, and sports activities, along with the possibility of working on homework.

Kompas runs later in the evening in connection with special occasions, such as pyjamas parties and other parties.



What do we eat for lunch?

Students can choose to either bring a packed lunch or eat at the school canteen.

Students in maternelle eat lunch in the classroom with the supervising adults. From 1st grade, the students eat lunch in the canteen, also under the supervision of adults. Every day the canteen offers a full menu (including an entrée, main, and dessert). Students can register for the canteen (on an annual or monthly basis) or buy a pack of individual meal tickets.

The director of the canteen and his team provide quality meals that are made in-house and that are as organic as possible.
